Notice of Privacy Practices

THIS NOTICE DESCRIBES HOW YOUR MEDICAL INFORMATION MAY BE USED AND DISCLOSED, AND HOW YOU CAN ACCESS THIS INFORMATION. PLEASE REVIEW CAREFULLY.

AuD Hearing is required by law to maintain the privacy of your health information and to provide you with notice of its legal duties and privacy practices with respect to your health information. How AuD Hearing May Use or Disclose Your Health Information

The following categories describe the ways that AuD Hearing may use and disclose your health information. For each category of uses and disclosures, we will explain what we mean and present some examples. Not every use or disclosure in a category will be listed. However, all the ways we are permitted to use and disclose information will fall within one of these categories.

- 1. <u>Payment Functions</u>: We may use or disclose health information about you to determine eligibility for plan benefits, obtain premiums, facilitate payment for the treatment and services you receive from health care providers, determine plan responsibility for benefits, and to coordinate benefits. For example, payment functions may include reviewing the medical necessity of health care services, or determining whether a particular treatment is experimental or investigational.
- 2. **Health Care Operations**: We may use and disclose health information about you to carry out necessary insurance-related activities. For example, such activities may include activities relating to plan coverage; submitting claims for stop-loss coverage; conducting or arranging for medical review, legal services, audit services, and fraud and abuse detection programs; hand business planning, management, and general administration.
- 3. **Required By Law**: As required by law, we may use and disclose your health information. For example, we may disclose medical information when required by a court order in a litigation proceeding such as a malpractice action.
- 4. **Public Health**: As required by law, we may disclose your health information to public health authorities for purposes related to: preventing or controlling disease, injury, or disability; reporting child abuse or neglect; reporting domestic violence; reporting to the Food and Drug Administration problems with products and reactions to medications; and reporting disease or infection exposure.
- 5. <u>Health Oversight Activities</u>: We may disclose your health information to health agencies during the course of audits, investigations, and inspections. Licensure and other proceedings related to oversight of the healthcare system.
- 6. <u>Judicial and Administrative Proceedings</u>: We may disclose your health information in the course of any administrative or judicial proceeding.
- 7. <u>Law Enforcement</u>: We may disclose your health information to a law enforcement official for purposes such as identifying or locating a suspect, fugitive, material witness or missing person, complying with a court order or subpoena and other law enforcement purposes.
- 8. <u>Coroners, Medical Examiners, and Funeral Directors</u>: We may disclose your health information to coroners, medical examiners, and funeral directors. For example, this may be necessary to identify a deceased person or determine a cause of death.
- 9. **Organ and Tissue Donation**: We may disclose your health information to organizations involved in procuring, banking, or transplanting organs and tissues, as necessary.
- 10. **Public Safety**: We may disclose your health information to appropriate persons in order to prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat to the health or safety of a particular person or the general public.
- 11. **National Security**: We may disclose your health information for military, national security, prisoner and government benefits purposes.
- 12. **Worker's Compensation**: We may disclose your health information as necessary to comply with worker's compensation or similar laws.
- 13. **Marketing**: We may contact you to give you information about health-related benefits and services that may be appropriate for you.



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When AuD Hearing May Not Use or Disclose Your Health Information

Except as described in this Notice of Privacy Practices, we will not use or disclose your health information without your written authorization. If you do authorize us to use or disclose your health information for another purpose, you may revoke your authorization in writing at any time. If you revoke your authorization, we will no longer be able to use or disclose health information about you for the reasons covered by your written authorization, though we will be unable to take back any disclosures we have already made with your permission.

Statement of Your Health Information Rights

- 1. **Right to Request Restrictions**: You have the right to request restrictions on certain uses and disclosures of your health information. AuD Hearing is not required to agree to the restrictions that you request. If you would like to make a request for restrictions, you must submit your request in writing to AuD Hearing at 875 Townline Rd, Suite 101, Lake Geneva, WI 53147.
- 2. **Right to Request Confidential Communications**: You have the right to receive your health information through a reasonable alternative means or at an alternative location. To request confidential communications, you must submit your request in writing to AuD Hearing at 875 Townline Rd., Suite 101, Lake Geneva, WI 53147.
- 3. **Right to Inspect and Copy**: You have the right to inspect and copy health information about you that may be used to make decisions about your plan benefits. To inspect and copy such information, you must submit your request in writing to AuD Hearing at 875 Townline Rd., Suite 101, Lake Geneva, WI 53147. If you request a copy of the information, we may charge you a reasonable fee to cover expenses associated with your request.
- 4. **Right to Request Amendment**: You have the right to request that AuD Hearing amend your health information that you believe is incorrect or incomplete. We are not required to change your health information and if your request is denied, we will provide you with information about your denial and how you can disagree with the denial. To request an amendment, you must make your request in writing to AuD Hearing, 875 Townline Rd. Suite 101, Lake Geneva, WI 53147.
- 5. <u>Right to Accounting of Disclosures</u>: You have the right to receive a list or "accounting of disclosures" of your health information made by us, except that we do not have to account for disclosures made for purposes of payment functions or health care operations, or those made to you. To request this accounting of disclosures, you must submit your request in writing to AuD Hearing at 875 Townline Rd., Suite 101, Lake Geneva, WI 53147. Your request should specify a time period up to six years and may not include dates before April 14, 2003. AuD Hearing will provide one list per 12 months free of charge. We may charge you for additional lists.
- 6. **Right to Paper Copy**: You have a right to receive a paper copy of this Notice of Privacy Practices at any time. To obtain a paper copy of this Notice, send your written request AuD Hearing at 875 Townline Rd., Suite 101, Lake Geneva, WI 53147.

Changes to This Notice of Privacy Practices

AuD Hearing reserves the right to amend this Notice of Privacy Practices at any time in the future and to make the new Notice provisions effective for all health information that it maintains. We will promptly revise our notice and distribute it to you whenever we make material changes to the Notice. Until such time, AuD Hearing is required by law to comply with the current version of this notice.

Complaints
